Parke County Redevelopment Commission

The Revolving Loan Fund is operated/approved by the Parke County Redevelopment Commission (PCRC). Their mission is to promote economic and community development for sustained and continued growth through increasing investment in our community. The PCRC strives toward business retention and expansion, new business attraction, capitalizing on technology and innovation while promoting entrepreneurship and education, and the promotion of community resources while preserving and improving infrastructure to create more, better-paying jobs; thereby improving the quality of life for all Parke County residents. The Revolving Loan Fund has proven to be a successful tool in fulfilling the PCRC mission. This program has given many individuals the opportunity to expand or retain their current business at a more affordable rate with longer terms of repayment than traditional bank financing. The program has also allowed individuals to realize the dream of starting a new business in Parke County.

Regional Wastewater

Our non-sewered communities have expressed a need for service. They understand for them to sustain residents and companies, have the ability to grow, and be competitive, it will require sewer service.

In response to this need, we have worked with the Parke County Redevelopment Commission to apply for grants to conduct a preliminary engineering report (PER). The PER will take a countywide view and contain a summary of existing conditions, needs, alternatives, present worth analysis of alternatives, nonmonetary considerations, recommended alternative(s), rate structures, and funding sources.

This report is necessary as part of the first step for filing a petition for sewer district formation. A clear illustration of, and description of, the proposed sewer district boundaries must be provided in support of the petition and will be included in the PER.

We were awarded two grants and a \$5,000 contribution from the Parke County Redevelopment Commission to pay for the PER. One grant was for \$30,000 from Indiana Finance Authority/State Revolving Fund — Regionalization Assistance Program and other grant was \$15,000 from USDA Rural Development.

The PER kicked off in May 2020 and is estimated to be completed by the end of 2020. Commonwealth Engineering Incorporated is the firm preparing the report.

Lee Alan Bryant (LAB) - Environmental Clean Up

Partnership Parke County lead discussions with the Indiana Brownfield programs and the Parke County Commissioners to address the LAB property that has been on the unpaid property tax list for several years and had environmental concerns. In working together, Indiana Brownfield agreed to fund the environmental assessment and asbestos removal project. To receive the State-funding we transferred the property to the Parke County Redevelopment Commission.

The asbestos removal project is wrapping up in June 2020. The 100+ acres surrounding the seven (7) acres owned by the County is for sale. We look forward to seeing what the future holds!
